ABOUT THE Y

At the Greater Valley YMCA, we are more than just a gym; we are a movement creating healthy, confident, connected and secure children, families and adults. Our mission is to put Christian principles into practice through programs that build healthy spirit, mind and body for all. At each of our separate but united branches, we strive to deliver programs that help each person achieve their best health. Our three focus areas of youth development, healthy living and social responsibility are the foundation of our programs and events, helping to improve the lives of individuals and communities. Every community member is welcome at the Y and served regardless of age, race, sex, religious affiliation or ability to pay. No child or family is ever turned away from the Greater Valley YMCA due to an inability to pay.

At our Easton/Phillipsburg Branch, we work diligently to serve the members of our Easton

and Phillipsburg communities. We offer a studio of fitness equipment, fitness classes for members of all abilities, an indoor pool and much more. Through relationships with various community health organizations, we hold educational seminars taught by professionals in the field. The topics range from diabetes prevention, to cardiovascular health, to financial planning and tax assistance. Our youth development programs help children learn the importance of healthy behaviors, as well as develop their minds in a safe and nurturing environment.

In our childcare programs, youth participate in educational activities informed by national best practices, keeping them engaged, healthy and social while they are in our care. At our branch, we offer School Age Child Care, Youth Summer Day Camp, and Preschool Programming.

SUMMARY OF THE PROPOSAL

Every summer, Y's across the nation provide the **Best Summer Ever** to thousands of children through Youth Summer Day Camp programs. At the Greater Valley YMCA, we work to create a camp program that keeps kids healthy and engaged, both physically and mentally. Our camp counselors undergo Y training that is focused on our mission and values, giving them the tools they need to be positive role models to children. At each of our branches, we plan fun activities to go along with weekly themes, such as Under the Sea, Superheroes, and Carnival, to name a few. Activities include team building, arts and crafts, sports and fitness, swimming, archery and much more. We incorporate learning into our programs to keep children's minds active in the months that they are not in school, as well as physical activities that teach kids the benefits of healthy living. We measure success of our camp program by the values learned by our campers. Identifying new friends, learning new skills and expressing feelings of belonging are all measures of a successful Y Day Camp.

At our Easton/Phillipsburg Branch, we host children at our location in Easton, where we have 13 acres of outdoor space, an indoor pool and an outdoor pavilion/recreation area for daily use by our campers. On average, we serve 130 children a week at our branch, with a total of 250 different campers the entire summer. As our Day Camp has been growing in popularity over the past few years, we will now be operating a second camp location out of Firth Youth Center in Phillipsburg, starting in June 2018. We are excited about this opportunity to reach more children in our communities and provide them with valuable skills for healthy living.

Some of the most anticipated activities of Day Camp that we offer are weekly on-site STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Math) programs to add value to the theme of the week, as well as to help kids continue learning throughout the summer months. The interactive programs/assemblies will take place at our branch. Education is an integral part of not only our Summer Day Camp, but also throughout the year in our various childcare programs. One major way we plan to incorporate STEAM into our camp is to partner with outside resources that teach valuable educational lessons through hands-on activities and opportunities these children do not normally have. We respectfully request a \$4,910 investment from the Easton Rotary Club to fund STEAM enrichment programs for our Youth Summer Day Camp.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

Statement of Need and How Proposal Addresses the Need

At the Y, we believe every child deserves access to a safe and nurturing environment. Therefore, we are constantly searching for new ways to expand our programs, while enhancing opportunities to learn, grow and thrive. We know that fields within science, technology, engineering, and math (or STEM) are rapidly growing across the nation, with a projection of 1.2 million U.S. jobs in the industry in 2018. However, despite the high demand for STEM careers, there are still many disparities that exist within the industry. In an attempt to alleviate these disparities, STEM programs have been growing in popularity in Y's across the nation. In recent years, art has become an important component in STEM programming, manifesting in areas like product design, problem solving and new and creative ways of thinking. The addition of art education in STEM has brought about "STEAM," representing educational areas of focus we integrate into all of our childcare programming.

STEAM is a core element in our child care and youth development programs. In our Youth Summer Day Camp, we work STEAM concepts into our curriculum in various ways to engage learning, from our Specialty Lego and Makers Lab Camps, to incorporating math into a cooking class, as well as other innovative strategies. Our staff work to plan and implement a camp program that is both fun and educational for the youth we serve. Continuing the learning process for students throughout the summer months is crucial to healthy development and increased success in their education. Our youth will be participating in on-site STEAM programming and one external STEAM field trip, enhancing the camp experience for our youth, sparking imagination and an interest in these various fields. In these programs, students will be having fun while learning, retaining information that will help them when school starts again.

STEAM enrichment programs will include the following:

- The **Lucky Dutchman Gem Mine** will bring their equipment to our branch, and children will be able to "pan" for gems. Campers will learn about the history of panning for materials such as gold, silver, and gems, as well as geology.
- The **Raging Reptiles** program and the **Lehigh Valley Zoo** will be delivering a class about reptiles and zoo animals. The instructors will be bringing some of these creatures along, including giant snakes and bearded lizards. Children will have the opportunity to hold and touch some of the reptiles that will be visiting our camp.
- **Book and Puppet** will be providing two separate programs for our different age groups at camp. The younger children will watch a puppet show, as well as learn some new tricks about puppetry. The older kids will learn how to create their own graphic novel or cartoons.
- **Science Story Telling** will deliver a program that puts science experiments into a hands-on show, action-packed with a story to go with.
- **Mad Science** assemblies include scientists completing interactive science experiments with the campers.
- The adventure to **Wildlands Conservancy** will afford campers the opportunity to go on a hike and learn about the nature and forest around them. They will also have the opportunity to go "ponding," in which they play on the docks and catch fish and frogs, as well as learn about them. Campers will also go in the creek to float or explore the rocks and water at this beautiful location.

Additionally, art education is an important component of our curriculum not only in Day Camp, but throughout the year in our childcare programs. We are grateful to have a large assortment of art supplies and materials for our children to use, allowing them to express themselves and create something entirely new and unique. This summer, we plan to partner with **Color Me Mine Lehigh Valley** to create a mural for our branch, something that our kids will all contribute to, giving back to the community. Color Me Mine's mural project is an interactive program in which one of their staff artists delivers a talk on kindness and positivity. This discussion leads to the creation of the mural, where each child will place a fingerprint or handprint on the mural and the staff artist will finish the piece off with a positive message done in hand-drawn calligraphy. The mural will be

displayed in a special place in our branch as a meaningful reminder to members and visitors of the power of kindness and of our daily mission to promote kindness.

Population to be Served

At our Easton/Phillipsburg Branch, we serve the residents of these communities and beyond. Many of these families are low-income and qualify for our financial assistance program. Last year, 53 of our 250 Easton Branch campers received financial aid to attend Day Camp. This service is made possible through our generous donors and community support, allowing children to experience the **Best Summer Ever**. The ages of the children who attend camp must have completed kindergarten and can attend up to 14 years old. Our camp runs 11 weeks, starting after area school districts dismiss for the summer. An investment from the Easton Rotary Club will allow us to provide 130 kids a week with the opportunity to participate in our Day Camp STEAM enrichment programs.

Goals and Measurable Outcomes

Our goal for Day Camp is to extend education through the summer to help prevent learning loss. We want our campers to feel confident in their abilities to master subjects such as science, math and literature, as well as to be able to express themselves through art. Success will be measured by participation and involvement of the children in these various programs, as well as learning new skills. Our ultimate goal in these programs is for campers to be happy and positive about everything they are learning.

Other Funding Sources

This request to the Easton Rotary Club for STEAM enrichment programs at Day Camp is the only request for all of these programs to be brought to our children. We are continuously looking for ways to enhance our Summer Day Camp program through partnerships and collaboration. Currently, we have a pending grant request to PennEast Pipeline for STEM programming, specifically for Mad Science assemblies for Day Camp, as well as for our School Age Child Care (SACC) programs across our association throughout the school year.

FINANCIAL INFORMATION

The budget for our STEAM Enrichment Programs at our Youth Summer Day Camp is included below. The on-site "field trips" will be held at our Easton branch location, and include the program instructor and all necessary materials for the assembly. The off-site field trip includes the cost of admission for the campers to Wildlands Conservancy. The Mural Project is a set cost that includes a discussion led by the Color Me Mine staff artist, and the art work they will be doing on the mural.




